

State of Nevada Serious Injury, Death, and Substantiated Child Abuse & Neglect

What do serious injury, death, and substantiated child abuse in child care mean?

A **serious injury** is [definition] an injury that requires medical attention from a healthcare provider.

Death in child care is the death of a child that occurred while the child was in licensed center, licensed home, or family, friend, and neighbor care that is registered on the Child Care Subsidy program.

Substantiated child abuse includes physical or sexual abuse, neglect, or maltreatment that was investigated and found to be true.

This table displays the annual number of serious injuries and deaths that occurred in licensed child care centers, licensed child care homes, license-exempt child care homes, and license-exempt child care centers, over a 3-year period (calendar year), statewide.
